 - Your right to object to processing You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
 - Your right to data portability You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal data you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.
 - Your right to withdraw consent When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent.
 - You don't usually need to pay a fee to exercise your rights. If you make a request, we have one calendar month to respond to you.

 can be requested to assist with processing if required, ie dyslexia, Irlens friendly.
